



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## ELA – Reading (5 Points each)

Squeezed into a ship called the *Amistad*, the 53 slaves aboard could barely breathe. Each day, the crew gave them sips of water and scraps of food. The slaves were beaten and chained.

They had been kidnapped from Africa. On July 1, 1839, they broke free. They killed the captain and took control of *Amistad* off Cuba's coast, making the ship a famous symbol of freedom.

The *Amistad* story is famous for the rebellion and for what followed. After breaking free, the slaves tried to sail the ship back to their native Sierra Leone, in West Africa. The U.S. Navy captured the ship off the coast of Long Island and charged the slaves with murder.

In 1841, the U.S. Supreme Court ruled that the Africans had been illegally kidnapped. The Court allowed them to return to Africa.
